- Gap analysis of the existing framework in view of INSPIRE requirements.



Awareness Raising and Communication

 - Ideas competition with students

INSPIRATION – Result 3



Ideas Competition:

The "INSPIRATION" ideas competition was asking the citizens of Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia and Kosovo* for concepts of mash-up applications based on INSPIRE or the national Spatial Data Infrastructures. - Deadline was 18 Feb 2013.

What are Mash Ups?

A map mash-up is a web-based application that merges data (sometimes from multiple sources) with geographic references into an interactive map. In recent years map mash-ups have become very popular methods of quickly generating simple maps of various types of phenomena that can be viewed by a standard web browser.











Success factors of setting up national SDIs



- Create political support via an SDI council
- Build a consensus process build on common interests and create a common vision
- Establish the institutional and policy framework: Policy, copyright, licensing and other rights to the use of data and information must be addressed and agreed
- Make spatial data and metadata available and accessible: this is the essence of SDI











INSPIRATION – Spatial Data Infrastructure in the Western Balkans

How can INSPIRATION contribute to achieving these goals?



- Creation of political support: Awareness raising and communication activities, including the "INSPIRATION ideas competition" (Activity 3)
- Establish the institutional and policy framework -Policy, copyright, licensing and other rights to the use of data and information must be addressed and agreed: Support in law drafting and individual country recommendations on legal and institutional issues (Activity 1)
- Focus on skills: Regional approach for capacity building and education (Activity 2)











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
